The closure of schools due to Covid will have affected different students in different ways. Some will have gaps in their knowledge, others will have made some gains in theirs. We will work with students to identify need and address it as required. We will provide the means for students to work independently according to their particular needs as well as addressing those needs in class.

The best thing we can do for our students going forwards is to teach them as well as we possibly can. We will initiate a coaching scheme to help ensure more excellent teaching across the school.

We believe that one of the impacts of the closures has been a significant reduction is time spent working alongside other students and adults, collaborating, communicating and socialising. We will review our curriculum to seek to provide greater opportunities for that kind of work to take place.

We believe that the social impact of Covid will last as long if not longer than the academic impact. We will invest in expanded inclusion support to increase our capacity to support our students.

Outcome 1

Students achieve in line with previous cohorts, maintaining the trajectory of academic improvement

Key Results

- Tracking data shows that Year 10 and Year 12 are on track to achieve as well as or better than previous cohorts
- Academic outcomes 2022 are in line with or better than CAGs 2020 and 2021

Outcome 2

Students reintegrate effectively, are happy in school and feel well supported

Key Results

- Attendance for half terms 4, 5 and 6 2021 is in line with or higher than previous years
- Student surveys summer 2021 shows high levels of satisfaction with all aspects of curriculum and pastoral support (75% agree or agree strongly)
